House and Dock Rules

Rockport Yacht Club (RYC) facilities are for the use and enjoyment of all members. The club is essentially a “do it yourself” enterprise with no paid employees. It is very important that all members observe these basic rules out of respect for others and to maintain a facility that we all can take pride in.

- 1. The Director of Facilities shall have the responsibility for enforcing these rules except the Vice Commodore shall be responsible for the Bar. Any board member shall act in the absence of the responsible party to avert a serious violation. The Board is responsible for disciplinary action.**
- 2. Members must accompany their guests at all times while on Club property. Members shall be responsible for conduct of their guests in accordance with these rules. Members shall host no more than five non-family guests at one time unless advance arrangements are made per Rule 12.**
- 3. Members and guests are expected to conduct themselves in a courteous and civil manner at all times while using Club facilities.**
- 4. Federal, State, County, City, and Aransas County Navigation District No. 1 laws, rules, and regulations pertaining to RYC activities shall be strictly observed at all times.**
- 5. The Club Bar is operated under license from the State of Texas and shall comply with all laws and regulations required by the license.**
- 6. No Club property shall be removed from the premises without specific authorization by the Director of Facilities or his designee.**
- 7. Swimming in the harbor and diving from Club premises is strictly prohibited.**
- 8. Pets shall not be allowed within the Club building, and must be kept under owner’s control at all times.**
- 9. All Club users are responsible for policing the premises and placing litter in receptacles provided for that purpose. Particular emphasis must be placed on proper maintenance of the heads. The Club provides no regular janitorial service, so each user is expected to do his share.**

- 10. Personal property cannot be stored in or around the Club premises without the written permission of the Director of Facilities. RYC is not responsible for loss of personal property left at Club facilities.**
- 11. Donations of furnishings and fixtures by RYC members as well as assistance in Clubhouse alterations and maintenance are welcomed and appreciated. However, in order to maintain consistent décor and functionality, all donations will be coordinated with the Director of Facilities for review with the Board.**
- 12. The Clubhouse may be reserved for private use by making reservation with the Director of Facilities. The party making the reservation shall be responsible for cleanup after the event in accordance with the agreement with the Club. Any fees and/or deposit will be in accordance with the guidelines approved by the board.**
- 13. RYC slips shall be available for lease by RYC members on a “first come, first serve” basis. The lease rates shall be consistent with the current Aransas County Navigation District lease with the Club. Payments will be semiannually or quarterly. Exceptions will require Board approval. Leasing shall be administered by the Director of Facilities with approval of the Board.**
- 14. Unoccupied slips leased to RYC members may be temporarily let by RYC with proceeds accruing to RYC.**
- 15. Transient boats may be accommodated at Club facilities for a daily fee approved annually by the Board. The Director of Facilities shall be responsibility for the transient dockage.**
- 16. With the approval of the Director of Facilities, RYC members shall be permitted to temporarily dock their boats in unoccupied RYC slips or alongside the clubhouse provided such use does not exceed 24 hours at any one time.**
- 17. Violation of these rules shall be subject to action by the Board.**
